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C. SYMBOLISM

The Broken Glass on the poster represents the Kristallnacht, the night of broken glass. This was an act of vandalism by the Germans that targeted Synagogues, Jewish places of worship, and Jewish-owned businesses. Thousands of Jewish businesses were destroyed.

There are small traces of red on the glass to symbolize the mass loss of the holocaust.

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d. ENDURING THE TEST OF TIME

Our project will last because students are able to be part of the project by signing the google form. People remember what they can be part of. Our goal is to get 50% or more people with responses that say they are informed about the Holocaust. We have permission from Mr. Seyford to put our poster in the art case, so our poster will be easily visible.
