1. Hedy stated: “My father was one of twelve brothers and sisters. Out of all the twelve brothers and sisters, only four survived. All the rest of them—uncles, aunts, cousins, young people—they were all killed. So from a large family, I have hardly any family. ...We never wanted to forget, nor do I want my children to forget, nor my grandchildren, because I feel like things like that can happen again.”

What can you do to make sure that people do not forget about the Holocaust? Now that you have this knowledge, how can you use it to inform others and help them to learn from the lessons of the Holocaust?
