



3. Jack explains that in Poland, he was not allowed to have weapons. He states, “You know here...I have weapons in my home; I couldn’t do that in Poland. ...Here I can defend myself; I couldn’t defend myself in Poland. That’s a big difference. I think a lot of people would have survived if they would have had weapons. But another thing is, nobody would believe that those things would happen.” This is an example of one freedom that Jack did not have in Poland that he does have in America.
